

## Speaker Biography



**Dan Batchelor**, BVSc DSAM DipECVIM-CA (Internal Medicine) MRCVS

Dan graduated from the University of Bristol in 1997. After some years in general practice in the United Kingdom and Australia, he moved to the School of Veterinary Science, University of Liverpool in 2002, where he was the Hill's Resident in Small Animal Medicine until 2007. He was awarded the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons Diploma in Small Animal Medicine in 2007, and became a Diplomate of the European College of Veterinary Internal Medicine and Recognised European Veterinary Specialist the same year.

In 2010 he completed PhD studies at the University of Liverpool in the field of molecular physiology, researching the regulation of intestinal glucose transporters in dogs and cats, and their relevance to diabetes mellitus and obesity. After a little more time in the research laboratory he rejoined the Medicine team at the Small Animal Teaching Hospital, University of Liverpool in 2011 as Clinical Teacher in Internal Medicine.

His clinical interests include all aspects of canine and feline internal medicine and his research interests include pancreatic disease and the regulation of intestinal function.
