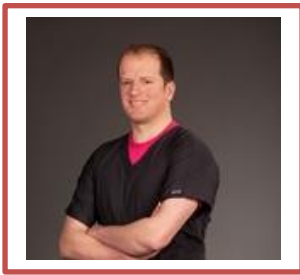


## Speaker Biography
